Hike and explore an endless variety of forest trails with private naturalist guides skilled at spotting wildlife including forays in the jungle at night and on hanging bridges and optional zip-lines through the rainforest canopy. Your Costa Rican guide and driver also introduce you to the friendly "Tico" culture of rural Costa Rica. The award-winning accommodations of Lapa Rios Ecolodge and Monteverde provide luxurious comfort, amenity, and serene ambiance in total harmony with nature. In San Jose you are warmly received at the Grano de Oro, a restored colonial mansion, our cozy home away from home. This Costa Rica rainforest tour is an ideal week-long romantic adventure for two, or a fun, active trip with family and friends.

Itinerary in Detail

DAY 1: SAN JOSE

Receive a warm Costa Rican welcome after passing through customs. A local representative will transfer you to overnight at **Hotel Grano de Oro**.



DAY 2: OSA PENINSULA

Your adventure into the wilds of the Osa Peninsula begins with an airport transfer for the one-hour flight to Puerto Jimenez. A 45-minute scenic drive in a 4WD vehicle past small farms and rural homes takes you to Lapa Rios Ecolodge. Perched on a breezy hilltop ensconced in a private rainforest reserve full of wildlife with stunning views to the sea, the Lapa Rios bungalows offer comforts of queen size beds, hardwood floors, private bath with indoor/outdoor showers, and a tranquil private balcony. The award-winning

ecolodge has gained notoriety for its creative gastronomy blending exotic tropical cuisines served alfresco by candlelight. Cool off under nearby waterfalls or in the small swimming pool surrounded by rainforest. *Read important information about Lapa Rios below.* Overnight at **Lapa Rios Lodge**. [BLD]

DAYS 3 AND 4: LAPA RIOS RESERVE

Enjoy two full days hiking and exploring among rivers, waterfalls, and natural swimming pools on miles of wilderness trails winding through the private reserve of Lapa Rios in Osa Peninsula. Hike with resident naturalist guides who help you find wildlife in the jungle and describe the complex ways that animals and plants co-exist in the tropical rain forest ecosystem. Relax and bird-watch from your veranda always listening and watching for birds flitting through the forest or fruits falling from above as monkeys and parrots feed in the canopy. Enjoy the pristine beach and tide pools a short walk down the hill. Onsite guided naturalist excursions of your choice are included by day, and a nocturnal walk in the forest at night, as well as the 'twigs, pigs and garbage' sustainability tour to see firsthand their commitment to environmental sustainability. Overnight at **Lapa Rios Lodge**. [BLD]



DAY 5: MONTEVERDE – CURICANCHA NATURE RESERVE

After an early breakfast transfer to Puerto Jimenez for the return flight to San Jose. Your naturalist guide meets you to begin a 4-hour journey by road into the Central Highlands to the Monteverde Cloud Forest, established and preserved in 1951 by a group of North American Quakers. Keep your camera handy as the bumpy road winds uphill offering splendid views and wildlife sightings along the way. In the late afternoon join a guided twilight walk on the loop trails of Curicancha Nature Reserve. Flashlights are required or bring your own headlamp in search of sloth, night monkeys, and a variety of nocturnal birds and insects. Frequently sighted mammals include armadillo, coati, agouti, kinkajou, ocelot, two-toed sloth, and three species of monkeys: mantled howler, white-faced capuchin, and spider monkey. Walking the forest at night is a magical experience to enjoy the nightly symphony of frogs and insects. Overnight at **Monteverde Lodge** or similar. [BLD]

DAY 6: CLOUD FOREST ZIP-LINING, HANGING BRIDGES AND TRAPICHE VISIT

Walk and/or fly through the cloud forest canopy on hanging bridges and a cable zip-lines. Hanging by a security harness, you zip-line between 14 platforms connected by stainless steel cables. The total length of the Monteverde zip-line is 1.8 miles gliding at 300 feet up! Thrill seekers will want to check out the Tarzan swing!

The less ambitious Sky Walk is a dramatic combination of six suspension bridges over deep canyons at tree top level combined with easy, well-maintained walking trails on the forest floor. Visit Juan de Dios' farm where he shares his rural life including the traditional sugar mill he operates. Juan tells you about the production of sugarcane and coffee, and the traditional ways of cultivating bananas, arracache (a local legume), avocado, macadamia nuts, and other Costa Rican specialties. A traditional oxcart pulled by oxen takes you to the sugarcane mill to see the operation and taste products made from sugar cane. Overnight at **Monteverde Lodge** or similar. **[BLD]**

DAY 7: AGUTI CLOUD FOREST PRESERVER - SAN JOSE

Grab your binoculars and water bottle as you set off with your guide in search of wildlife in the Aguti Cloud Forest Preserve. Your guide shares their vast knowledge of the cloud forest as you hear the primal sounds of the howler monkey and watch the leaf cutter ants busy at work. Be on the lookout for the elusive resplendent quetzal as well as the three-wattled bellbird and emerald toucanet. With over 2.5 miles of walking trails the Aguti Reserve is part of the great conservation complex that includes the Monteverde Cloud Forest Biological Reserve and the Children's Eternal Rainforest Reserve among others. After lunch head back to San Jose. Overnight at **Hotel Grano de Oro**. **[BL]**



DAY 8: DEPART

Transfer to the airport approximately three hours before your scheduled international flight. **[B]**

40 LB. PER PERSON BAGGAGE WEIGHT LIMIT ON DOMESTIC FLIGHTS AND SMALL BOATS

There is a 40 lb. per person baggage weight limit per person for transportation on domestic airline flights and small boat trips within your itinerary plus a 10 pound carry on (including camera equipment). The airline and boat operators enforce these limitations on your checked baggage for safety reasons. You and your small carry-on bag will be weighed separately. To comply with these requirements, we suggest that you repack only the items needed for the portion of your itinerary that includes these modes of transportation, and leave other items behind in storage. If you are returning to the same San Jose area hotel, simply request to store your excess luggage at the hotel. If you are not returning to the same hotel, give your extra baggage to your transfer driver to be stored by your ground operator. Request that your luggage be brought to you upon your pick up and return transfer from the plane or boat portion of your trip. Please ask your service guide in Costa Rica if you have any additional questions regarding this policy.

NOTE: Wildland Adventures, Inc. has arranged your trip utilizing the travel services of local in-country ground operators who are independent contractors. These local outfitters, lodges, hotels and other suppliers of your travel services will make every effort to conduct this trip as described in the itinerary. It is however possible that due to transportation schedule changes, weather, delays and unforeseeable acts of God, humans or nature, this itinerary may vary from what is described. Participants must assume all risks whether identified in advance or unforeseen. All optional activities are at your own risk. Extra costs due to unexpected changes in your itinerary for reasons beyond our control are not included. Accommodations



HOTEL GRANO DE ORO, SAN JOSE

Hotel Grano de Oro is a renovated stately Victorian mansion built at the turn of the 20th century and updated with the warmth and comfort of a private home. Thirty-two individually styled rooms, common areas, and corridors are elegantly decorated with watercolors, tapestries, and locally handcrafted furniture creating charm and character in traditional Latin American style and heritage. Hotel Grano de Oro is one of the finest boutique hotels in Costa Rica for its charm and friendly warmth. It is located on a quiet street near many fine restaurants, theaters, and shops. Some of the best cuisine and wines in Costa Rica are served in an intimate dining area and garden courtyard. The open-air Jacuzzi on the rooftop garden terrace is a perfect spot to begin your Costa Rica adventure! Services include currency exchange, wifi, gift shop, room service, laundry, TV.



LAPA RIOS LODGE, OSA PENINSULA

Lapa Rios is a first-class rainforest lodge with a spectacular hilltop setting. Bungalows are situated on a terraced bluff with well-maintained stairway-trails down from the reception and hilltop restaurant. Be prepared for some hill walking! Lapa Rios Lodge offers accommodations in total harmony with its surroundings. Open air bungalows are fully screened with large verandah, private tiled bath/shower and comfortable beds with mosquito netting. There is a swimming pool, gourmet restaurant, full bar, and three-story observation catwalk. The 1,000-acre Lapa Rios Private Rain Forest Reserve offers excellent wildlife viewing. Miles of private

trails lead you through a rainforest wilderness with rivers, waterfalls, and natural pools for swimming. Resident naturalist guides have years of experience guiding in the reserve. Enjoy the beach, explore tide pools, take surfing lessons, or spend the day relaxing and bird watching from your verandah.



MONTEVERDE LODGE & GARDENS, MONTEVERDE

Walk through the glass cathedral entry of Monteverde Lodge and you appreciate the modern design and rustic elegance of this mountain inn with high wooden ceilings, open fireplace, family-style restaurant, and cozy lounge with sofa and wrap-around windows. Spacious rooms feature large windows bringing the forest close at hand. Beautiful landscaped gardens invite guests to explore a plethora of flora and fauna of the cloud forest including butterflies, hummingbirds, toucanet and monkey, among the flowers, orchids and epiphytes in forest trees. There is no TV but wi-fi is available throughout the property.

Important information about Lapa Rios Eco-lodge

All guided rainforest tours operated by Lapa Rios are included in the cost of your reservation. **Some of the hikes have middle to high difficulty level.** The Sustainability tour and the visit to the local school (when in session) are free of charge as well. You need to sign up for these tours directly upon arrival.

The Lapa Rios Ecolodge is in a wilderness setting 12 miles from the office communication center. There are no phones or fax machines at the Lapa Rios. Communication between the office and the Ecolodge is by marine radio for emergencies. We have several trips daily by car between the two locations to transport faxes or messages. To make a personal telephone call it would be necessary to take a 45 min taxi ride to the office.

Lapa Rios is a biological reserve. **Considerable stair climbing is required to get to and from the bungalows and main lodge.** Bungalow access requires stair and path walking, therefore we would appreciate it if you could notify us in advance regarding any inability to walk steps. We do everything we can to preserve the natural environment and bring the rainforest and its inhabitants as close to our guests as we can get them while respecting their need for safety. The whole cast of jungle characters is present. The wildlife is abundant in the common areas and near the bungalows. The bungalows themselves can be visited by a variety of small insects and creatures but nothing large or dangerous. Tolerance of this ever-present animal population is a necessary compromise in order to enjoy it here.

Food & Menus: Although remote and isolated (No Phones) Lapa Rios serves food and beverage not usually offered in the wilderness. Meals rotate daily, focusing on fresh fruits, and vegetables with local fish, chicken and meat. A full service bar mixes favorite beverages, fresh juices, wines and spirits. Meals are from a menu that changes daily. There is 24 hour generated electricity (hairdryers cannot be used). Laundry service is available.

What to Bring: Guests are encouraged to bring only lightweight, casual clothing, sunscreen, a bathing suit, sturdy shoes or hiking boots with deep traction and a large beam flashlight. All in-country flights have a 40 lbs. Baggage limit / person. Additional luggage can usually be accommodated for an extra charge. Store the excess in San Jose hotel.

Rainforest and Other tours: The private reserve offers thousands of species of trees, plants, over 300 bird species, insects and mammals. Using the reserve support the ongoing preservation of over 1,000 acres of tropical rainforest. A variety of educational half-day tours hike deep into the rainforest. Trips to the interior of the reserve require a staff naturalist.

Professional Community Tours: Sea kayaking, botanical orchid garden, deep sea fishing, in-shore morning fishing on the gulf, on-shore fishing, 5 hour guided mangrove river and gulf boat ride, horseback riding in the jungle and along the beaches and professional massage therapy services. Tours offered depending on professional guide availability.

Gratuities at Lapa Rios

Though tipping is exclusively at your discretion, industry guidelines suggested that \$10 per person per day is an appropriate general tip. With the exception of nature guides, all gratuities will be divided among the entire staff. If a particular member of our staff provides you with exceptional service, you may request a special envelope from the reception and leave a tip for them individually. For your information, Costa Rican law specifies that restaurant staff automatically receives a 10% gratuity for all food and beverage purchases. You can leave all gratuities in the tip box found at the reception desk. Most guests take care of tips at the time of check-out so you don't have to carry money with you. They can be paid in cash or credit cards).

PAYMENTS, CANCELLATIONS AND REFUNDS
